



2010 ANNUAL REPORT

Mission:

The mission of the Del Mar Foundation is to promote civic pride and cohesiveness, acquire and preserve open space, improve beaches and parklands, raise and grant funds, and sponsor diverse cultural programs and community events in Del Mar.

About Us:

As Del Mar's oldest 501(c)(3) non-profit, the Del Mar Foundation sponsors programs, makes grants, and manages over \$1,000,000 in endowment funds to benefit the community and the San Dieguito Lagoon. The community endowment provides long-term funding stability for community needs.

Best known for our Summer Twilight concerts, First Thursdays cultural arts series, and children's events such as the Easter Egg Hunt and 4th of July Parade, the Foundation sponsors a wide array of community programs. The Foundation also provides financial support to community organizations and projects such as the Del Mar Library, Lifeguards and the Beach Safety Center, the Del Mar Garden Club, Del Mar Community Connections, and the Shores acquisition. Over the years, the Foundation has served as an incubator or fiscal sponsor for many of the present day non-profits that so greatly enrich our community.

Programs:

The Foundation's Summer Twilight Concert series in Powerhouse Park marked its 27th year in 2010, with performances by Mrs. Robinson, Rockola, The U.K. Beat and Atomic Groove. Since the first Twilight Concert was held in Seagrove Park in the summer of 1983, the summer concerts have been a great Del Mar tradition, providing an opportunity for families, neighbors and visitors to socialize, picnic, and enjoy music together as the sun sets over the ocean. The summer concerts are complimentary to the public and therefore, the Del Mar Foundation relies on grants from the county, corporate sponsors and contributions from individuals to support the cost of the summer events.

The Cultural Arts Committee offered a diverse array of musical, theatrical and other cultural arts performances in 2010, including the popular First Thursdays series that sells out each year, and special performances by The John Jorgensen Quintet (Django-style jazz) and two nationally acclaimed bluegrass bands, The Gibson Brothers and Laurie Lewis & The Right Hands. The committee was formed in 1999 to organize cultural arts events in the Del Mar Powerhouse, following the restoration and renovation of the Powerhouse after a successful three-year fundraising campaign undertaken by the Foundation's Powerhouse Committee.

In 2010 the Hospitality Committee originated and produced The Newcomer Guide with essential information about Del Mar for new residents. The on line version (on our web site) includes a Short History of Del Mar, Facts about The City, Del Mar's Citizens, Unique Del Mar, Basic Information and Phone Numbers. A short version with the Basic Information and Phone Numbers was printed as a trifold brochure and distributed.

2010 was a great year of fun family activities organized and staffed by volunteers on the Del Mar Foundation Children's Committee. Local residents came together to enjoy the group's "Craft and Concert" series with crafts sponsored by the Del Mar Library, our annual Easter egg hunt and 4th of July parade, the endless summer celebration: "Take Back the Beach" and Family Bingo Night. The year's events culminated in December with a joyous holiday party that featured a marionette show called "Santa's Workshop". Del Mar children and families dressed in their holiday best and came to enjoy the show, holiday refreshments, complimentary photos and bid on great auction items donated by area organizations. All auction proceeds benefit the 2011 Children's programs.

The Children's Committee welcomes volunteers who are looking to give back to the community and provide families with exciting, culturally diverse opportunities to come together with friends new and old. The group meets the last Wednesday of each month during the school year at the Del Mar Library.

Grants

In keeping with our mission, the Del Mar Foundation makes financial grants to organizations for the betterment of the Del Mar community.

Special Donations: In addition, a structured effort has been implemented through the Development Committee to support Del Mar Community residents who wish to fund a special project that meets the objectives and mission of the Del Mar Foundation. A recent example is the dog and people fountain that, in collaboration with the City of Del Mar, was installed at the north end of Dog Beach and fully funded by a grant from Sharon and Richard Bockoff. The Del Mar Foundation continues to identify and develop new grant ideas with the support of our donors and volunteers.

Endowment

The Community Endowment was launched in 2007 with the visionary support of the Founding Endowment Circle, each of whom pledged between \$10,000 and \$50,000 to the endowment and its start-up administrative support. This endowment now has net assets of \$623,743. As its

principal grows, the endowment will enable the Foundation to use a portion of the earnings generated to expand our grants to the community and continue funding our programs.

Planned Giving

In 2010, the Del Mar Foundation established a planned giving program called “The Legacy Society” to provide various ways for individuals and families to include the Del Mar Foundation in their estate plans. This program is an important way for people to leave an enduring legacy that benefits our community and ensures that the work of the Foundation can continue for generations to come.

A wide range of planned giving options is available, including bequests, retirement plan assets, life insurance, life tenancy and income-producing gifts. Information regarding The Legacy Society can be found on our website and has appeared in our newsletter and other communications.

Board of Directors

The Foundation is governed by a 15-member volunteer Board of Directors. We are an active hands-on organization, relying on volunteers and donations from throughout the community. Members of the Board may serve two 3-year terms. Many members stay involved as active participants on one of our committees.

DMF 2010 Annual Report-Financial Statement Comments

The following financial statements are excerpts from the 2010 Financial Statements that were compiled by the certified public accounting firm of Jenkins, Bowler & Perkins LLP. A complete copy of this compiled report is available upon request from the Del Mar Foundation office.

Statement of Activities

In 2010 the Foundation raised \$73,216 in donations. Of this amount, \$63,216 was directly to support the Foundation's operations and \$10,000 was designated to our community endowment.

The Foundation received \$71,710 in program income, which includes ticket sales, grants and sponsorships for the various community programs it produced. These programs include the Twilight Concerts, the Cultural Arts events, and the Children's programs. Expenses of \$56,935 were incurred in producing these programs, resulting in a surplus of approximately \$14,775 from these activities.

Grants made by the Foundation in support of community activities and projects amounted to \$19,841 in 2010. Grants were made to the Friends of the DM Library – teen, children & adult programs ; Del Mar Garden Club – DM City Hall landscape & beautification ; Books & Beyond – T-shirts for Energy & You Power Pals curriculum; Silver Age Yoga Community Outreach, Inc – senior yoga program; Del Mar Junior Lifeguards—Junior Lifeguard scholarships; Friends of Del Mar Parks--Cinema Series; DMCC-Brain Fitness computer program & contribution towards purchase of new community van; Keep Del Mar Clean-partial funding of pilot program of "Big Belly" trash compactors; Playwrights Project-Write On!; and DM TV Foundation--Youth Ambassador Program: Part Three: Mentorship editing.

Management and General Expenses totaled \$103,615, of which approximately \$24,148 was associated with fundraising, with the balance associated with the general operation and management of the Foundation. These expenses were incurred to promote the Community Endowment, to establish a Planned Giving program, to support the tracking and follow up of our expanding donor base, to communicate with our constituents, and for general administrative activities.

The Foundation's net assets increased by approximately \$83,137 during 2010 to a total of \$1,467,974, due to investment gains of approximately \$131,128 offset by net operational expenses (revenues less expenses) of approximately \$47,991.

Statement of Financial Position (Balance Sheet) and Net Asset Analysis

The net assets of the Foundation as of 12/31/10 amounted to \$1,467,974, of which \$299,101 were in Operating Funds and Reserves, all of which can ultimately be used for the payment of operating expenses or grants. This operating fund net asset balance includes \$54,804 in pledges receivable, meaning that the funds have been pledged, but the pledge payment has not yet been received. As these pledges are paid, these funds will become unrestricted.

The Community Endowment, which is the endowment to be used for the support of the Foundation's expenses and grants, had net assets as of 12/31/10 of \$623,743. Unrestricted net assets in this endowment fund amounted to \$216,214 and Permanently Restricted net assets totaled \$407,529, of which \$340,225 was from contributions that have been received and invested, and \$67,304 was from pledges receivable.

The Lagoon Endowment had, at 12/31/10, net assets of \$545,130, all of which is Temporarily Restricted. This is a fund that is overseen by the Foundation for the future benefit of the San Dieguito Lagoon maintenance. These funds were provided to the Foundation by the San Dieguito River Park Joint Powers Authority.

Statement of Cash Flows

During 2010 the Del Mar Foundation had a positive cash flow from operating activities of \$90,211 of which \$53,625 was used for investment activities. The remaining difference of \$36,586 resulted in a total December 31, 2010 ending cash balance of \$184,346.

Explanatory Notes to the Financial Statements

1) Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Method of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

(b) Basis of Presentation

The Foundation follows the provision of Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (“SFAS”) No. 117, *Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations*. SFAS No. 117 requires that net assets, revenue, gains, expenses, and losses be classified as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, and permanently restricted.

A summary of the net asset categories included in the accompanying financial statements is as follows:

Unrestricted – Unrestricted net assets included amounts that are available for support of the Foundation’s operational and administrative functions and amounts that are available to support community activities and charitable endeavors at the discretion of the Foundation’s Board of Directors.

Temporarily Restricted – Temporarily restricted amounts represent funds, the principal of which may be expended in the future for a specific purpose (e.g. the Lagoon Endowment Fund) and contributions receivable that upon receipt will be transferred to unrestricted funds.

Permanently Restricted – Permanently restricted net assets represent those assets contributed to the foundation where the original dollar value is to remain in perpetuity as a permanent endowment of the Foundation.

(c) Investments

Investments consist of marketable securities. Marketable securities consist of U.S. government securities and debt and equity securities. Equity securities with readily determinable values and all debt securities are carried at fair value. Fair value is determined by quoted market prices on the last business day of the year.

Investments acquired by gift are recorded at their fair market value at the date of the gift. The Foundation’s policy is to liquidate all gifts of investments immediately upon receipt.

(d) Pledges Receivable

Pledges receivable reflect the present value of the future receipt, discounted at a rate of 5% per annum as of December 31, 2010.
